
INSTITUTE OF GEOLOGISTS OF IRELAND

new body was recently formed to represent the professional Geologists of Ireland; the Institute of Geologists of Ireland (IGI) is a new representative and registration body for professional geologists in Ireland. It is responsible for professional standards and has disciplinary powers, as well as certifying professional geologists working in this country. The new society held its inaugural meeting at University College, Dublin recently. Its aim is to promote the science and practice of geology so that society and the environment can be thus protected and improved.

At the meeting, the IGI adopted a Constitution, a Code of Ethics and a CPD policy for its members. EurGeol Dr. Eibhlin Doyle PGeo said at the meeting, "The IGI provides a focus for all professional geologists who contribute to Government, academia and industry and practice in a wide range of disciplines, including environmental science, engineering geology, hydrogeology, mining and quarrying, petroleum geology, research and development, as well as in various regulatory agencies."

Currently over 50 per cent of the professional geologists in the country are members but over time Dr. Doyle said that it is the institute's objective that all professional geologists practicing in Ireland should be registered with the IGI.

The Institute is also affiliated to the European Federation of Geologists (EFG), which now has 20 member countries, representing about 75,000 geoscientists worldwide.
