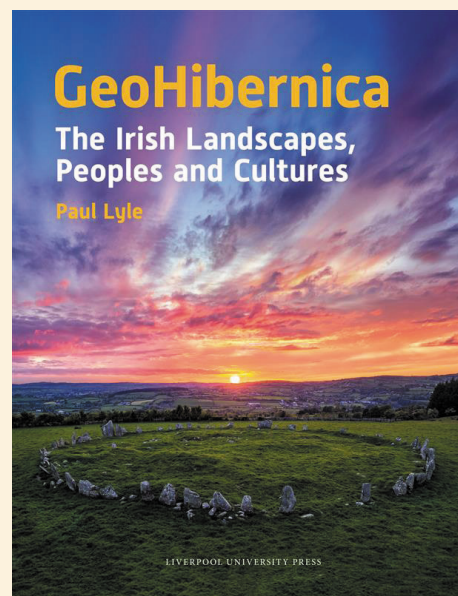

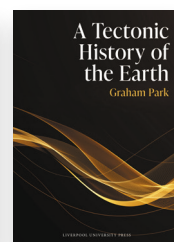
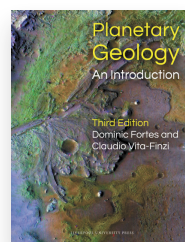
AUTHOR INFORMATION
